Registration Quick Guide

Online Registration Requirements

When you register for the SAT' you'll need to supply:


- Your full legal name as it appears on your photo ID, your date of birth, gender, mailing address, and current grade level.
- An acceptable photo of yourself that closely resembles the photo on your ID and that will match how you look on test day. See details below.
- Your high school.
- The test date and the test center you're choosing.
- Acceptance of our Terms and Conditions for taking the SAT.
- Payment or a fee waiver.

Contact Customer Service or visit collegeboard.org/contact-us if you don't have access to online registration.

Photo Requirements

You must submit a photo when you register. Make sure your photo meets these requirements:

- You're easy to recognize.
- You're the only one in the picture.
- It shows a head-and-shoulders view, with your entire face, both eyes, and hair clearly visible; head coverings worn for religious purposes are allowed.
- · You're in focus, and there are no dark spots or shadows.
- The photo is not altered using visual effects, such as social media filters, lenses, or icons.

Test Day Checklist

Before Test Day
Print your admission ticket You must show your printed ticket to be admitted to the test center. Sign in to your online College Board account at collegeboard.org/mysat to confirm your seat and print your admission ticket. If you made any changes to your registration, be sure to print and bring the updated ticket.
Check your photo ID You need to bring a photo ID that's valid (unexpired), original, government or school issued, and that bears your full legal name. The name on your ID must exactly match the name on your admission ticket. If you travel to another country to test, you must provide a passport as identification. Additional ID requirements may apply—visit sat.org/id.

☐ Check the latest Terms and Conditions online

You'll be agreeing to the Terms and Conditions as they exist on test day. Go to sat.org/test-security prior to test day to review any updates.

☐ Check the SAT Test Center Closings page

Always check sat.org/test-center-closings to make sure your test center is open. Check on Friday night and again on Saturday morning.

On Test Day


Bring these things

- · Printed admission ticket
- Acceptable photo ID
- Two No. 2 pencils that have erasers
- An acceptable calculator
- Mask or face covering


Don't bring these things

- Mobile phones, smartwatches, or wearable technology such as fitness trackers—these will be collected and held during testing.
- Other prohibited items—see the full list at sat.org/test-day-checklist.

Test coordinators will match their roster with your ticket, ID, and appearance.

Getting and Sending Scores

What You Need to Know

WHEN WILL I GET MY SCORES?

Your SAT scores will be available to you online about 2–3 weeks after test day. Note: If you took a state-provided SAT with Essay, your Essay score may be added a few days after the other scores. We won't send your score report to your colleges until all your scores are online.

Go to sat.org/scores to see updated SAT score-release dates.

HOW DO I GET MY SCORES?

Online: All students will get their scores online at studentscores.collegeboard.org through their College Board account. You'll get an email telling you how to sign in to your online score report when scores are ready.

Phone: You can get SAT scores by phone starting on the day they're released online, but there's an extra fee.

WHAT DO MY SCORES MEAN?

Your score report gives you information about your strengths and areas for improvement. Some quick facts:

- Your total score on the SAT is the sum of your Evidence-Based Reading and Writing section score and your Math section score. The total score is reported on a 400–1600 scale.
- You'll also see other scores, subscores, and color-coded graphics to help you better understand your performance across the sections of the test.

HOW DO I SEND MY SCORES TO COLLEGES?

You decide which colleges, universities, or scholarship programs College Board should send your scores to. You can:

- Send scores with your registration. Your test registration fee covers 4 score reports. We'll send just the scores from the registered test date (or you can change this default online).
- Send score reports at any time. There's a fee for sending additional score reports (fee waiver users can send unlimited additional reports for free). Send scores by using your online account or through MyCoalition.

WHEN WILL COLLEGES GET MY SCORES?

Score recipients listed on your registration receive your scores online within 10 days after you receive all your scores. Additional reports take 1–3 weeks to process after we receive the request. Rush reporting is available for an extra fee. Keep in mind that institutions vary in terms of how and when they receive scores and how long they take to process them.

If you've tested more than one time, you can also consider Score Choice™. Score Choice is a score reporting feature that lets you choose which scores—by test date—you send to colleges, in accordance with an institution's stated scoreuse practice. It's optional—if you decide not to use Score Choice, your six most recent SAT scores will be sent to your recipients. You should feel comfortable sending all your scores, because most colleges consider a student's best score. Scores from up to six past administrations of the SAT Subject Tests™ are also included.
