The spell bowl team finished 5th out of 33 schools at the state finals. There was not a class designation this year at the state finals. We had 4 near perfect spellers and 2 perfect spellers. Also Van Foresman competed in the individual state event and was a perfect speller and earned gold.

The JGHS Guidance Department hosted representatives from Bethel University on October 24, 2022 for a Financial Aid Night. The presenters shared information on completing the FAFSA, a required financial aid form for attending college. They also shared information about scholarships, grants, federal programs and loans for college financial help, and answered specific questions. About 31 people attended the event which was held in the JGHS Media Center. The Bethel representative and guidance staff stayed and helped one family resolve issues with their FAFSA submission after completion of the program. It was a successful event!
