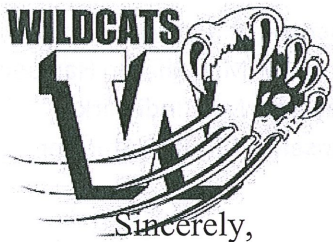

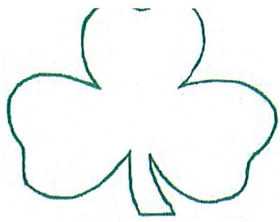

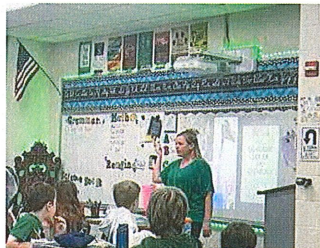
### Junior Achievement Guest Speakers – 6<sup>th</sup> Gr. Classroom

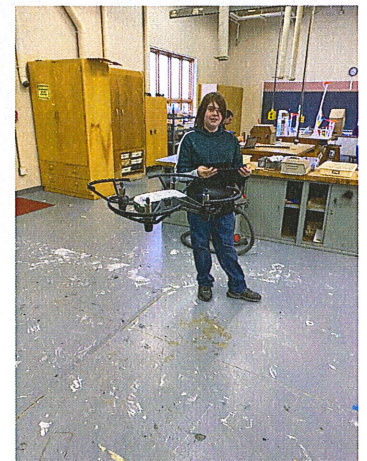
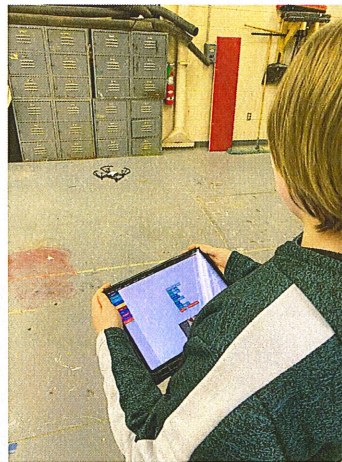
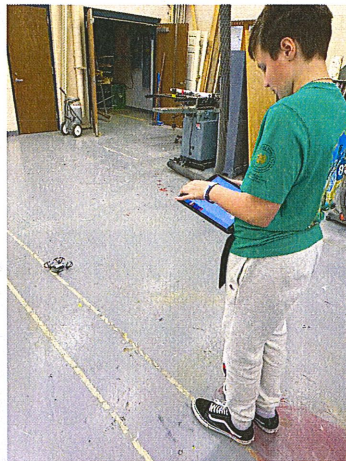
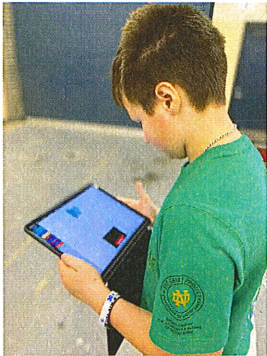


Students are using problem solving to construct various structures for an architecture activity.
