- 6th Grade Volleyball started this week with 16 6th grade girls participating.

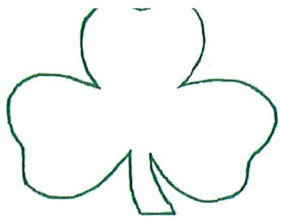

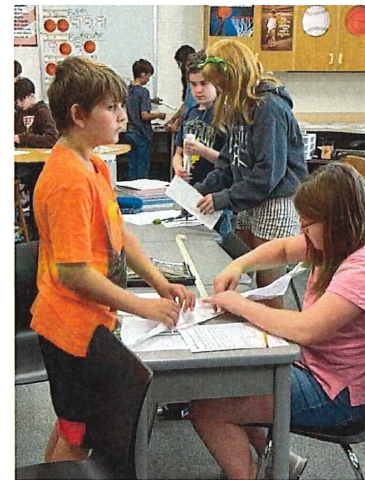
