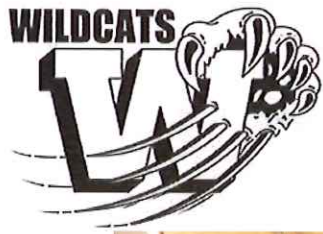

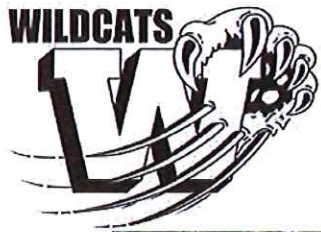

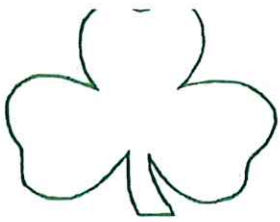

## John Glenn FFA Horse Judging Team Earns Reserve World Champion Honors at AQHYA World Show

The John Glenn High School FFA / Marshall County 4H Horse Judging Team has once again demonstrated their exceptional skill on the national stage. Competing at the **American Quarter Horse Youth Association (AQHYA) World Championship Show** in Oklahoma City, the team of **Cassie Roush, Nora Guseilla, Savannah Hawley, and Adin Daren**, captured the title of **Reserve World Champion Youth Horse Judging Team**.

This prestigious event brings together the best youth horse judging teams from across the United States and beyond, challenging participants to evaluate and rank classes of horses, defend their placings through oral reasons, and demonstrate a deep understanding of equine conformation and performance standards. The Reserve World Champion title places the John Glenn trio second only to the top-ranked team in the world.

All three team members are active in the **John Glenn FFA** and have built a remarkable record in national horse judging competitions. Over the last several years, their **lowest finish** has been an impressive **third place**, consistently earning top honors against elite competition from across the country. Their success is a testament to countless hours of practice, dedication to studying breed standards, and teamwork both in and out of the judging arena.

Looking ahead, the team will represent **Indiana** at the **All American Quarter Horse Congress** in Columbus, Ohio, this **October**. Known as the largest single-breed horse show in the world, the Congress will once again offer them the opportunity to showcase their judging expertise on one of the sport's biggest stages.
