2. Approve Transfer of Appropriations of General Fund, Capital Projects Fund, and Transportation

The superintendent stated that the budget is prepared 18 months in advance and Treasurer, Darlene Flora, does a great job anticipating how to allocate funds and keeping the amount of funds that need transferred to a minimum.

After a brief discussion, a motion was made by Mike Daube, seconded by Jeff Johnson, to approve the transfer of appropriations of the General Fund, Capital Projects Fund, and Transportation. The motion was approved by a seven to zero vote.

3. Approve Purchase over \$5,000 – Upgrade Wireless Link between UMS and NLES

Andrew Stegemiller, Technology Coordinator, stated that the current connectivity between UMS and NLES communicates at 15 megabits per second (Mbps). The rest of the corporation communicates at a rate of approximately 1000 Mbps, so NLES is overdue for an upgrade. Quotes were received for the upgrade and Mr. Stegemiller recommended that the link be purchased and installed through Maplenet Wireless at a cost of \$20,974.80. This work will be paid for out of the Common School Loan.

After a brief discussion, a motion was made by Jeff Johnson, seconded by Mike Daube, to approve upgrading the wireless link between UMS and NLES in the amount of \$20,974.80. The motion was approved by a seven to zero vote.

4. JESSE Reorganization Discussion – Linda Holland

Linda Holland provided the board a potential proposal for the JESSE reorganization and provision of services. The reorganization of JESSE involves moving students back into his or her home district. The JESSE staff will also become part of the corporation staff. There will be four service districts that will have individual leadership and some shared services. The JESSE board is currently working on a resolution that will need to be adopted by each individual school corporation.

REPORTS

1. Superintendent's Report

The superintendent provided the board with 4 Star School data for 2010-11. John Glenn High School missed qualifying as a 4 Star School by a very narrow margin.

The superintendent also reported on possible changes in summer school structure for 2012. The high school would have two sessions with session I lasting four hours per day for a total of four weeks.

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Session II at the high school would consist of six hour and 10 minutes of instruction per day for a total of 13 days. The elementary and middle schools would be in session for six hours and 10 minutes per day for a total of 13 days. All of the aforementioned totals up to 80 hours of instruction. This would allow the second summer session to end sooner and provide students a longer break before returning to school for the regular school year.

2. Conference Requests

The school board was provided with a listing of conference requests.

BOARD COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS

Jeffrey Johnson informed the board of the upcoming ISBA Leadership Seminar on January 20, 2012. Mike Daube thanked Jeffrey Johnson for his term as president of the board and for excellent leadership. He also recommended Brett Eastburn's book as an inspirational read.

Tom McCormick commented on the state initiated school calendar survey that he filled out. The results will be tallied soon and distributed.
