

School Board Meeting – June 5, 2012  
Regular & Executive Session

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL – 7:00 P.M.

ESTABLISH A QUORUM AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Board of School Trustees of the John Glenn School Corporation met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on June 5, 2012 in the John Glenn Administration Building. Board members present were Janice Ryan, Mike Daube, Bill Groves, Dennis Holland, Jeff Johnson, Tom McCormick, and Curt Pletcher. Richard Reese, Superintendent, and five observers were also in attendance. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance led by School Board President Janice Ryan.

RECOGNITIONS

Tim Davis, Principal of Walkerton Elementary School, thanked Mrs. Carey, Mr. Maudlin, Mr. Winchell and Mr. Morton for helping get summer school off to a good start. The Summer Food program is off to a good start also. The first day we served 143 for breakfast and 324 for lunch. Today 175 were served breakfast and 330 were served lunch. A list of the Fourth Nine Weeks and Second Semester Honor rolls was presented. Mrs. Kara Kaser was congratulated on having some of her teaching ideas included in the book, *“Differentiation that Really Works: Strategies from Real Teachers for Real Classrooms, Grades 6-12”*. The book is published by Profock Press. The board watched a video produced by WES Guidance Counselor Mrs. Deb Mosson about the WES Peace Pole dedication.

Janet Carey, Principal of North Liberty Elementary School, asked the board to accept the following donations: \$300 from NIVA (Northern Indiana Volleyball Association) for NLES Athletics; \$100 from Shannon Stuart for the Summer Reading Program; \$100 from First Source Bank for the Summer Reading Program; \$250 from NDFCU in honor of Mr. Adam Mishler being selected a WNDU-TV Award for Excellence in Education recipient. Special thanks to Marlene Hadden and Denise Brooks for organizing the annual field day events. Staff and parents helped make the day a complete success. It was a great team effort. The sixth grade celebration was organized by Chris Houston, Brunie Mihail, and Michele Weiss. Janice Allsop and Melanie Heiser served refreshments. Retired JGSC teacher, Val Clauss, made a guest appearance to hand out the Cyndi Williams award. Progress continues on the new drive and Media Center renovations at NLES. The board was invited to stop by and take a look at the progress.

Mark Maudlin, Principal of Urey Middle School, congratulated the following students for awards that they received at Awards Night on May 17<sup>th</sup>: UMS Outstanding Eighth Grade Students for 2011-2012 were Anthony Borrelli, Chelsea Groves, Dayna Gumm and Alec Runyan. In all, 121 students were recognized for their academic, attendance and athletic accomplishments. One hundred and twenty-one UMS students earned the privilege to go on a trip to Indiana Beach on June 6.

### NEW BUSINESS

The JGHS Boys’ Basketball Team will be traveling to Wisconsin to participate in a basketball tournament against schools in the Midwest. This trip will also be used as a team building activity for the varsity players for 2012-2013. The team will depart on June 17, 2012 and return on June 20, 2012. This trip will be paid for by the players and coaches through the boys’ basketball account.

5. Approve JESSE Stimulus Asset List

As one of the final steps in the JESSE de-centralization, all equipment purchased through stimulus funds must be approved as part of the John Glenn School Corporation fixed asset inventory. All of these items are in John Glenn School Corporation buildings and will be added to the inventory.

After a brief discussion, a motion was made by Mike Daube, seconded by Dennis Holland, to approve the JESSE Stimulus Asset List. The motion was approved by a seven to zero vote.

REPORTS

1. Superintendent's Report

The Superintendent reported that excavation for the new drive at NLES has unearthed debris that needs to be removed. There is limited money available to cover the additional cost. Updates to the water heater and various doors in the building will be necessary in the near future. Brad Schmeltz discussed with the School Board various topics including: removal of the debris found during excavation of the NLES drive site; fill options for the site; replacement of the water heater at NLES; replacement of some of the original doors in the NLES building; the past repairs and current condition of the JGHS tennis courts.

JGHS Tennis Coach Tammy Pudlo provided the board information on the deteriorated state of the tennis courts. Various repair options were discussed as well as the possibility of applying for some grant money.

Bus inspection was held on May 29, 2012. All John Glenn busses passed inspection. Cindy King, the bus drivers and Hamilton's Service Center were commended for the excellent care they take of the bus fleet.
