# School Board Meeting – March 15, 2016 Regular Session

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL – 7:00 P.M.

#### ESTABLISH A QUORUM AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Board of School Trustees of the John Glenn School Corporation met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on March 15, 2016, at the John Glenn Administration Building. Board members present were Janice Ryan, Jeff Johnson, Tom McCormick, Bob Borlik, Dennis Holland, Curt Pletcher, and Bill Groves. Richard Reese, Superintendent, and fifteen observers were also present.

## RECOGNITIONS (WES, NLES, UMS, JGHS)

Mr. Tim Davis, Walkerton Elementary Principal, recognized teachers and students at WES in grades three through six. All students in these grades recently took the first round of ISTEP and third grade students are currently in the middle of the IREAD+ test. Mr. Davis announced that Josh Knowlton won two awards at the Notre Dame Regional Science Fair. One of the awards received is the JINA award which comes with a free week of camp at the ART 2 Science Camp, to be held at Notre Dame in July. Mason Kobelt placed second in the 95 pound weight class at the State Folk Style Wrestling Finals in Indianapolis. Mrs. Dana Ferman and her aides were recognized for a wonderful PTA Parent Night on Thursday, March 3, 2016. The theme was "Dr. Seuss on the Loose" with over 100 parents and students attending. On Saturday, March 5, 2016, the Fifth Grade Girls' Basketball A-Team competed in the North Liberty Tourney. In the first game, the girls defeated Bremen, and then faced North Liberty in the final round, winning the Championship. Mr. Ryan Reese and his third grade basketball team recently won their division in the Plymouth Winter League, finishing 9-1, while the sixth grade boys' AAU team, made up of sixth graders from WES and NLES, recently won the AAU Tournament held on March 5, 2016. This same team also won the Northern Indiana Spring Shootout tournament at West Noble School. Mr. Davis asked the School Board to accept the following donation of \$111 from the WES PTA for ISTEP Snacks. The Social Skills group at WES, which meets each Friday to work on communication skills, modeling appropriate behavior, and having fun in an inclusive setting with a diverse group of third, fourth, and fifth grade students, was recognized for their many service-oriented activities.

Mr. Romer, North Liberty Elementary Principal, reported that Daniel Solymosi, sixth grade, received the One Book, One Michiana Award for an excellent junior project at the Northern Indiana Science and Engineering Fair at Notre Dame University. Daniel also received the Water Crusader Award for outstanding work in understanding and promoting the importance of water environment. The North Liberty Fifth Grade Girls' Basketball Tourney was very successful, with Walkerton and North Liberty making it to the A team championship round. She will be recognized at an awards ceremony Tuesday, March 22, 2016, 3:00 p.m., in the Colfax Auditorium at the

St. Joseph County Public Library, and will also receive a \$50 Visa gift card. The Sixth Grade Travel Basketball Team, comprised of Walkerton and North Liberty students, won the March Madness Classic Tourney held at John Glenn High School on March 5, 2016, and also donated \$2,000 to Isaac Porogi.
