School Board Meeting – May 15, 2018 Regular & Executive Session

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL - 7:00 P.M.

ESTABLISH A QUORUM AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Board of School Trustees of the John Glenn School Corporation met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on May 15, 2018, at the John Glenn Administration Office. Board members present were Jeff Johnson, Dennis Holland, Christian Mattix and Janice Ryan. Bob Borlik, Bill Groves, and Curt Pletcher were absent. Richard Reese, Superintendent, and 11 observers were also present.
