School Board Meeting – June 5, 2018 Regular Session

<u>CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL</u> – 7:00 P.M.

ESTABLISH A QUORUM AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Board of School Trustees of the John Glenn School Corporation met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on June 5, 2018, at the John Glenn Administration Office. Board members present were Jeff Johnson, Dennis Holland, Christian Mattix, Bob Borlik, and Janice Ryan. Bill Groves and Curt Pletcher were absent. Richard Reese, Superintendent, and seven observers were also present.

RECOGNITIONS (WES, NLES, UMS, JGHS)

Mr. Tim Davis, Walkerton Elementary Principal, presented to the Board the fourth nine-weeks and second semester honor rolls. Mr. Davis next announced WES had 37 students with perfect attendance for the entire school year. Each of these students received a t-shirt stating "Perfect Attendance All Year". Mrs. Raquel Snyder organized the WES Field Day on Thursday, May 31, 2018. Mr. Davis reported all students and staff had a wonderful time and the weather was perfect. Mr. Davis awarded 33 Presidential Awards to students in sixth grade. Twelve Gold Awards went to students who made the Distinguished Honor Roll at least three times this year; and 21 Silver Awards went to students who made the Honor roll at least one time this year. In closing, Mr. Davis congratulated Lorelei Burdick for receiving second place in the VFW District Essay Contest.

Mr. Randy Romer, North Liberty Elementary School Principal, asked the Board to accept a donation of \$50 from Falcon 500 for Minds In Motion. Mr. Mark Maudlin, Urey Middle School Principal, announced the annual Urey Middle School Transition Day was held on Friday, May 18, 2018. The 2018-2019 Seventh Grade class enjoyed the day as they spent time getting to know the building. The students learned what to expect as they begin their middle school years. Urey Middle School choirs consist of 87 student-singers and are under the direction of Mr. Jordan Dollins.

The John Glenn High School Music Department was recently awarded the ISSMA (Indiana State School Music Association) All-Music Award for the 2017-2018 school year. John Glenn is one of only eleven high schools in Indiana to receive a Total Department Award. In other news, students participating in the Automotive Technology Program have been progressing through their course work and testing. John Glenn students hold 35 ASE Certifications. In sporting news, Cici Delinski qualified for the State Track Meet on Friday, June 1, 2018, at Indiana University in the 300 meter hurdles. Robbie Berger was awarded First Team All-NIC and named NIC Most Valuable Player. Mason Ryans and Cooper Gean were awarded Second Team All-NIC Outfield, and Easton Stephens was awarded Second Team All-NIC Third Base.
