1. Advanced Placement/Dual Credit Presentation - Rose Dodson

1. Superintendent's Report

Mr. Richard Reese, Superintendent, informed board members of the proposed plan to make up the eight school days missed during the severe winter weather. Mr. Reese reported that five of the snow days will be made up with the snow make-up days built in to the 18-19 school calendar. Due to the Corporation being named a Performance Qualified School Corporation by the DOE, the other three days will be waived. Essentially, the school buildings will need to complete at least the minimum number of instructional minutes required before any days may be waived. All four school buildings will meet this requirement by May 30, 2019, and therefore will not need to complete the last three snow make up days. An official board vote will be held at the next school board meeting.
