# School Board Meeting - September 17, 2019 <br> Regular \& Executive Session 

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL - 7:00 P.M.

## NEW BUSINESS

## 1. Adopt Preliminary Bond Resolution

This resolution is part of the General Obligation Bond process and establishes a maximum amount to be borrowed, which is approximately $\$ 1.9$ million. Representatives from BakerTilly were present to answer questions from the Board. It was noted by Mr. Todd Samuelson, of BakerTilly, that there will be no impact to the Debit Service Levy. In conversation and question answering by Mr. Samuelson, Mr. Winchell, and Mr. Bendy, it was summarized that these proposed 2019 General Obligation Bonds will replace older bonds that will be paid in full at the end of 2019. This essentially keeps the Debit Service Tax levy the same and is an effort to keep the full tax rate stable. It was further noted that the Assessed Valuation of the School District, the circuit breaker credits in light of St. Joseph County's tax exempt expiration, and the Operations Fund Growth Quotient are all unknown variables at this time that could still impact the overall tax rate aside from this Bond and the Debit Service portion of the total tax rate. Bob Borlik made a motion to approve the Preliminary Bond Resolution and Curt Pletcher seconded the motion. The motion passed with a six to zero vote.
2. Approve Science Trip to the Galapagos Islands, Spring Break 2020

Science Teacher, Kay Freehauf, is planning on taking a group of 19 students, along with 13 chaperones, to the Galapagos Islands over Spring Break, 2020. Jeff Johnson made a motion to approve the Spring Break 2020 trip to the Galapagos Islands and Curt Pletcher seconded the motion. The motion passed with a six to zero vote.

## 3. Approve First Reading of NEOLA Policy Revision Volume 31, No. 2

Bill Groves made a motion to approve the first reading of the NEOLA Policy Revision, Volume 31, Number 2. Curt Pletcher seconded the motion, and the motion passed with a six to zero vote.

a. ISTEP testing results
i. Mr. Winchell shared information with the Board concerning ISTEP test results, noting that the Corporation increased its State ranking from 80 to 52 for the 20182019 school year.
b. ADM
i. Mr. Winchell led a discussion concerning student enrollment count and noted that he predicts seeing a growth in resident enrollment as well as transfer enrollment. Mr. Winchell noted that he will have updated ADM numbers for the board at the October $1^{\text {st }}$ meeting.
c. RFP
i. Mr. Winchell stated that he has received eight replies to the RFP advertised. Two of those companies were Guaranteed Savings Companies, five were Architect/Engineering Firms, and one specifically deals with LED lighting. Future review of the information provided by each company will be held to determine which company with whom the Corporation will choose to work.
d. 2020 Budget
i. Mr. Winchell noted to Board members that the 2020 Budget was provided in the board packet for their review.
