Mr. Ryan Knowlton made a motion to approve Consent Agenda Items 1-3, and Mrs. Kathy Jaworski seconded the motion. The motion carried with a vote of five to zero.

Mr. Winchell made the following special notes:

- Geoff Jankowski made the tough decision to step down from teaching at JGHS because he is going to be coaching football over at Bremen. Geoff has been a great asset to the John Glenn community as a professional educator, both inside the classroom and through coaching. We wish him well. He epitomizes building relationships with kids to help them grow.
- Taylor Kalucki has been on a one-year maternity leave this school year, which our contract allows us to grant a teammate. She has made the decision not to return at this time to spend more time with her family. We would be happy to welcome her back in the future.
- Kelley Edelbrock has resigned to return to full-time retirement, and Addie Baker will move into a full-time position. When Mrs. Hannah took over as the Director of Special Education, we hired Addie Baker to fill her position as the Case Conference Chairperson, but she could only work part-time. Kelley Edelbrock had recently retired and was willing to come back and help fill the other half of the position. Now Mrs. Baker is ready to accept the full-time Case Conference Chairperson position.
- Gregg Goewert has faithfully served Urey Middle School for the last five years. Preliminary test scores show significant growth from last year to this year, which you are aware was a point of focus for the UMS team. Mr. Goewert has decided it is time to slow down a bit from the pace and commitment of being an administrator. He is very excited to head back into the classroom and teach Business. He is a licensed Business and Physical Education Teacher.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Approve Overnight Field Trip – Football Camping Trip

Mr. Winchell reminded the Board that all overnight field trips require board approval. The football team would like to go on a camping trip this summer. We appreciate coaches who are willing to put trips like this together for our students. Mr. Jared Egger made a motion to approve Overnight Field Trip – Football Camping Trip, and Mr. Christian Mattix seconded the motion. The motion carried with a vote of five to zero.

2. Approve Summer School Staff

Mr. Winchell explained that all of our teachers have a contract that runs from July 1st through June 30th each year, which is outlined in the Master Teacher Contract. Teachers who teach summer school have an additional contract. We also hire additional staff such as instructional aides, bus drivers, and cafeteria staff to work summer school. Also included in this recommendation are positions that are listed as part of Appendix C in the Master Teacher Contract. Mr. Christian Mattix made a motion to approve Summer School Staff, and Mr. Jared Egger seconded the motion. The motion carried with a vote of five to zero.

3. Approve Adult Meal Prices for 2025-2026 School Year

As you will remember, we updated the student meal prices at a previous meeting. Now we are recommending the same price increase to the adult meal prices for the next school year. Mr. Jared Egger made a motion to approve Adult Meal Prices for the 2025-2026 School Year, and Mrs. Kathy Jaworski seconded the motion. The motion carried with a vote of five to zero.

4. Approve Purchase over \$75,000 – Roofing at North Liberty Elementary School

Mr. Winchell reminded the Board that any purchase over \$75,000, but under \$300,000, requires special board approval and three quotes from a competent bidder. Purchases over \$300,000 require architectural/engineering specifications and have to go out to bid. For purchases under \$75,000, we have permission to take care of those expenses, and you approve them under the consent agenda at each meeting. As part of our ongoing Master Facilities Plan and our roofing plan, we are scheduled to complete a section of roofing at North Liberty Elementary School. As you know, we have partnered with Morris & Sons Roofing for the last several years to provide inspections, preventative maintenance, and small repairs. They have been an excellent partner. As a municipality, we have to spend our money in a way that we know what our budget is going to be. Having partners who give competitive prices, swift and extensive customer service is extremely important. Morris & Sons has submitted the lowest bid in the amount of \$98,335. Mr. Christian Mattix made a motion to approve Purchase over \$75,000 – Roofing at North Liberty Elementary School, and Mr. Ryan Knowlton seconded the motion. The motion carried with a vote of five to zero.

2. Superintendent's Report – Mr. Christopher Winchell

Mr. Winchell reported the following:

- Tomorrow is the last day of school! Congratulations to the students and staff for making it to the finish line of another school year.

- Commencement will be held on Friday at 7 PM, rain or shine. If the weather cooperates, we will be on the football field; if not, we will be in the gymnasium.
- We have talked a lot about the legislative changes as a result of Senate Bill 1, particularly relating to funding and taxes. There have been many changes to the teacher evaluation process, the TAG Grant, and the return of A-F letter grades for schools, to name a few. We will spend time this summer digesting all of these changes and making plans for the smoothest implementation for our staff. We will also hold several work sessions with the Union Discussion Team. Specifically, here at John Glenn, we will have to substantially update our EE Plan (Educator Evaluation Plan). Our collective bargaining process will also be changed. We have a very strong working relationship with our Union Team and look forward to discussing these items and making our best plan.

BOARD COMMENTS/QUESTIONS

Mr. Egger asked if the sinkhole at UMS has been fixed. Mr. Winchell noted that as of now, following much evaluation and discussion, it is fixed.

Mrs. Jaworski noted that she attended the Retirement Celebration last week and was in awe of the many years of dedication our staff gave to John Glenn. She also noted that the information that was shared at the ISBA event at the beginning of the month was excellent and had a lot of detail.
