Blessings in a Backpack provides elementary school children who are on the federal Free and Reduced Price Meal Program with a backpack of food to take home for 38 weekends during the school year. Backpack food includes easy-to-prepare, ready-to-eat foods, like granola bars, juice boxes, mac and cheese, and oatmeal.

We are starting a "Blessings in a Backpack" program at North Liberty Elementary School. It costs approximately $\$ 80$ per child (this covers all weekends during the traditional 38 week school year). There are currently over 200 students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch at North Liberty Elementary. Potentially some of these children could be going hungry on the weekends. Our goal is to raise $\mathbf{\$ 4 0 0 0}$ in order to begin this program in August 2015. If $\$ 4000$ is raised, $\mathbf{5 0}$ children could be supported during the 2015/2016 school year. 100\% of money raised is used to purchase food for NORTH LIBERTY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL.

One hundred sixty NLES students participated in the 49 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Annual Tri Kappa Art Show. First place ribbons went to Allison Vandall, $6^{\text {th }}$ grade for her illustrated initial and Ayden Smigielski, $1^{\text {st }}$ grade for his brown bear created in Eric Carle style. Marshall Platz won a third place ribbon with his "Bird in Birch" painting.

Unlike previous years, not every student from NLES had an art project submitted for the art show. Several factors played into this decision. Since this is my first year teaching art I have spent a lot of time working with students on concepts like the color wheel and how colors are created, using a variety of medium to create those colors and allowing the students to experiment with various medium to see how each produces a different result. This experiential approach allows students to gain a variety of skills but does not always produce a project to display.

Since I didn't require everyone to enter a project, periodically I would remind students about the art show and encouraged anyone who wanted to submit an art project to give it to me to keep. My experience has been that most students are anxious to take their art home and share them with their family. Since most of our art projects take several art periods to complete students are always anxious when they have completed it to take the completed piece home.

Next year I will be encouraging more students to enter the Art Show and will also be working at some ideas of how to showcase what each grade level is working on.
