2020 North Liberty Youth League Code of Conduct

Due to increasing violence and rising numbers of abuse incidents in our nation's youth programs during and after games, the NLYL Board of Directors have unanimously approved a "Code of Conduct" related to inappropriate behavior at practices, games and NLYL sponsored activities. The Board feels that league officials, parents and coaches should be proactive in seeking a safe and instructive environment for children without the threat of violence, inappropriate behavior or language on the sidelines.

NLYL has a Board of Directors. These individuals are responsible for the activities your children are participating in. One of them will be available at every game. Please find one of these individuals if you see activities that concern you, so we may correct the problem.

While most inappropriate behavior is obvious, the actions that will not be tolerated include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Parents and fans on the field without permission.
2. Inappropriate language
3. Yelling negative comments at the umps or opposing players
4. Instigating players, parents, officials
5. Trashing fields or equipment
6. Attending events drunk or smelling of alcohol.
7. Smoking or using alcohol on the park grounds is strictly prohibited.
8. Physical displays of aggression or threats of physical aggression
9. Any action that officials or coaches deem to be inappropriate or the individual has previously been asked to stop doing.

Any player, coach, official, parent or fan, participating in inappropriate behavior WILL BE EJECTED from the park grounds. In cases where the offending party does not cooperate and leave the area, the police will be immediately contacted for the immediate removal from the property. A league report will be filed and the person may be suspended from the park for a time period between one day and one year from the date of the offense. Based on the nature of the offense, charges may be filed against the individual. Threats of or physical displays of aggression will be reported to the police. Any ejected person has the right to an appeal hearing by the Board of Directors. All parties involved will be notified and invited to attend the hearing which will be scheduled within 10 days of a written request.

The NLYL hopes the policies will ensure a safe, tolerable environment for your family to be around and your children to play in. Thank you for doing your part to help!

North Liberty Elementary IREAD-3 Parent Information Letter

3rd Grade Student and Parents:

On March 16-18, 2020 testing will occur for your 3rd Grade child to be administered the IREAD-3 assessment. The information below provides some information with more facts on the IDOE website. A short [three-minute video](#) is provided as well by the IDOE.

Purpose of IREAD-3:

The purpose of the *Indiana Reading Evaluation and Determination (IREAD-3)* assessment is to measure foundational reading standards through grade three. Based on the Indiana Academic Standards, *IREAD-3* is a summative assessment that was developed in accordance with House Enrolled Act 1367 (also known as Public Law 109 in 2010), which "requires the evaluation of reading skills for students who are in grade three beginning in the Spring of 2012 to ensure that all students can read proficiently before moving on to grade four."

IREAD-3 Blueprint:

The assessment measures foundational reading standards through grade 3. The chart below provides some information on the three strand areas to be tested.

Strands Assessed	Description	Percentage Range
Reading: Foundations Reading: Vocabulary	Questions may include identifying beginning, middle, and ending sounds; identifying synonyms, antonyms, homographs, and suffixes; and using context clues to determine the meaning of unknown words in a text.	25-35%
Reading: Nonfiction	Questions may include comparing and responding to grade-level informational text by making connections and/or predictions while reading, and identifying important information within text (e.g., problem and solution, cause and effect, main idea).	30-40%
Reading: Literature	Questions may include comparing and responding to grade-level text by recalling and/or describing story elementary (e.g., plot, character traits and development, problem and solution), and identifying the theme and narrator of different literary genres.	30-40%

Results:

In the past, the school has received Pass or Fail scores around early April. Once received, our plan is communicate with you the results and a plan of recourse if not passing the test.

Summer School and IREAD-3 Retest:

Elementary Summer School Session is anticipated for June 2 – June 26 from 8:00-12:00 at Walkerton Elementary School. We will administer the Summer IREAD-3 retake test the week of June 15 or June 22.
